Queer couples who met on Tinder and want to marry their match can visit bigtinderwedding.com.au to share their love story and apply to be one of the winning couples of an extra special wedding, valued at \$25k per couple. The winners will be chosen based on the couples' creativity and the uniqueness of their Tinder love story.

Love stories are unfolding on Tinder every day, in fact in a recent Tinder survey 55%** of respondents confirmed they know someone that has married their Tinder or dating app match, and 40%** say they've been to at least one dating app wedding - with 36%** attending up to three. Globally Tinder's LGBTQIA+ member base has grown at twice the rate of its overall base, and non-binary is the No. 1 "more genders" choice in the app***.
